Highlights

October 2021

General Body Meeting

The board started preparing for the annual General Body Meeting that will take place in December. The BOT and EC General Secretaries will work together to coordinate and plan the event.

BOT Officers Terms

All BOT officers' terms are expiring. In January 2022, a new Chairman, a Vice Chairman, a General Secretary, and a Finance Director will be selected by board members for a term of 2 years. Board members who are interested in any of these were invited to reach out and start a shadowing process, particularly for the Finance Director and General Secretary positions.

Bylaws Committee

Continuing the effort to refresh our bylaws, an email was sent requesting community input on the proposed amendments to the bylaws.

Capital Project

The team continued its work in this month of October:

- Questions that came up in the BOT Survey were reviewed.
- The team partnered with the Fundraising team to prepare for the fall fundraising event to be held in November.
- The team continued sending out its monthly Newsletter to the community.


IFN Clinic


The clinic filled the position of Coordinator and reopened onpremise screenings at IFN. The Telehealth continued and saw 30 patients by end of September.

General Body Meeting

The BOT held its annual General Body Meeting on December 5 and again on December 12, since quorum was not met at the first meeting to vote on the proposed IFN Bylaws Amendments. At the second meeting, the 1/6 quorum was met (at least 94 members) and the vote on the amendments was held. For any proposed amendment to pass, a minimum a $3/4^{th}$ (75%) affirmative vote is required. Here are the results of the vote:

































IFN Elections

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2021 Audit Update

Audit Update 2021

IFN Financial Statements have been audited by independent CPA firms since 2004 thru 2019.

Alhamdulillah, for each of these years, the auditors have issued unqualified audit opinion - which means that the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting and are free of any material misstatements.

Our current auditors have retired and discussions are ongoing with a new auditing firm for conducting the 2020 financial statements audit.

IFN Reserves

IFN Reserves Report

- IFN Cash in Bank as of Sep 30, 2021 is \$879,076
- \$350,000 will be kept as cash reserve.
 - \$633,000 has been transferred to North America Islamic Trust (NAIT), current value \$675,894.
 - We received a yield of \$17,600 in Jan 2021.
 - We will know the return of 2021 investment in NAIT in Jan/Feb 2022.

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IFN Endowment

IFN Endowment Report

- IFN Endowment Fund (IFNEF) Assets:
 - One townhouse property with rental income
 - Total Cash & Investment value as of Dec 1: \$914,828
 - Total \$174,296 cash assets as of Dec 1, 2021 to be targeted for investment with Sharia Portfolio, the portfolio manager.
 - \$600,000 has been transferred to Sharia Portfolio, current value as of Dec 1 is \$690,000.
